**Measles should be highly suspected if you answered YES to at least one item in B and C, PLUS a YES in D or E or F. IMMEDIATELY:**

- Mask and isolate the patient (in negative air pressure room when possible) AND
- Call Northeast Tri County Health at the numbers below
  - o 509-684-2262 during normal business hours
  - o 509-684-2262 after hours (duty officer)

**Next Steps:**

- Identify all students and staff that are insufficiently immunized. Sufficient immunity is defined as:
  - o Children 1-3 years old that have 1 MMR vaccine
  - o Children 4 or older that have 2 MMR vaccine
    - NOTE: Children receive their 2<sup>nd</sup> dose of MMR between 4 and 6 years old. Please identify students in this age range who only have 1 dose of MMR. They may need to get a 2<sup>nd</sup> dose promptly in an outbreak situation.
  - o Adults born after 1957 that have 1 MMR vaccine or evidence of immunity (below)
- Persons are considered immune (not susceptible) to measles if any of the following apply:
  - o They were born before 1957
  - o Medical documentation they have had measles
  - o They have laboratory evidence of immunity to measles (antibody titer)
